

## Driving to Mann Island

Mann Island is easy to reach by road. The Strand (A5036), the main road that passes outside Mann Island, connects the city centre with the A561 to the north and the A562 to the south. These main roads then connect with the main ring road (A5058), Queens Drive.

Nearby motorways include the M57 to the north, the M62 to the east and the M53 in Wirral.

The city centre location means the highway network can suffer from high levels of congestion during peak times.

As well as basement parking, there is a multi-storey car park for 3000 cars within the Liverpool ONE development. This offers staff and visitors secure, off-site parking for an hourly fee. This car park is located 500 metres from Mann Island.

## Motorbikes and Scooters

There is currently no provision for the safe storage of motorbikes and scooters.

## Visitors

There is ample parking for bicycles and private cars, as described in this guide. Mann Island is considered to be highly accessible by rail, bus and ferry, so visitors have a wide range of travel options to choose from when visiting Mann Island.

## Site specific Travel Plan

A survey of Merseytravel staff commuting habits will take place three months after the move has taken place.

The first travel survey of all the site occupants (commercial and residential) will be undertaken when the development is 75% occupied. This will take the form of a travel survey on the TravelWise website.

## No. 1 Mann Island

The Mann Island development consists of three main buildings containing 376 residential apartments, 13,079sqm of commercial property, 7,236sqm of bars, cafes and retail spaces and 1,247sqm of public space.

Two of the buildings are residential, with retail and leisure facilities at ground and first floor levels. The third building contains the office element of the scheme.

## Walking to Mann Island

Mann Island is located close to major tourist attractions, public transport facilities, offices and retail areas in the city centre. It's easy to reach Mann Island by foot. Most of the city centre is within a 1600m walk from the site. There are pedestrian crossing facilities at the Mann Island/The Strand/James Street junction just outside the building.

## Cycling to Mann Island

There are 111 secure and underground cycle parking spaces provided for residents and staff at the development. Merseytravel staff have access to parking for 50 bicycles provided on LB01.

If you cycle to work, you'll be able to use the showers and changing facilities provided in the new building.

Cycle Route 56 of the National Cycle Network runs through Liverpool city centre and onwards towards Sefton Park and beyond. Cycle Route 56 links Pier Head with the Wirral via the Mersey Ferries terminal and also connects with Cycle Route 62 (The Trans Pennine Trail). Bikes can be taken free of charge on Mersey Ferries.

## Buses to Mann Island

Many bus routes serve the area around Mann Island. You'll find a map of these services on the middle page of this leaflet.

Liverpool ONE Bus Station is located about 600m away. There is also a main bus and rail interchange on James Street, less than 200m away.

## Trains to Mann Island

The nearest train station is James Street, less than 200 metres away. James Street is served by frequent Wirral Line trains. Hop on the Wirral Line one stop to Moorfields to connect with Northern Line trains, or two stops to connect with City Line and long-distance trains at Liverpool Lime Street station.

If you're travelling to Mann Island from Lime Street, hop on any Wirral Line train and get off two stops later at James Street.

## Mersey Ferries to Mann Island

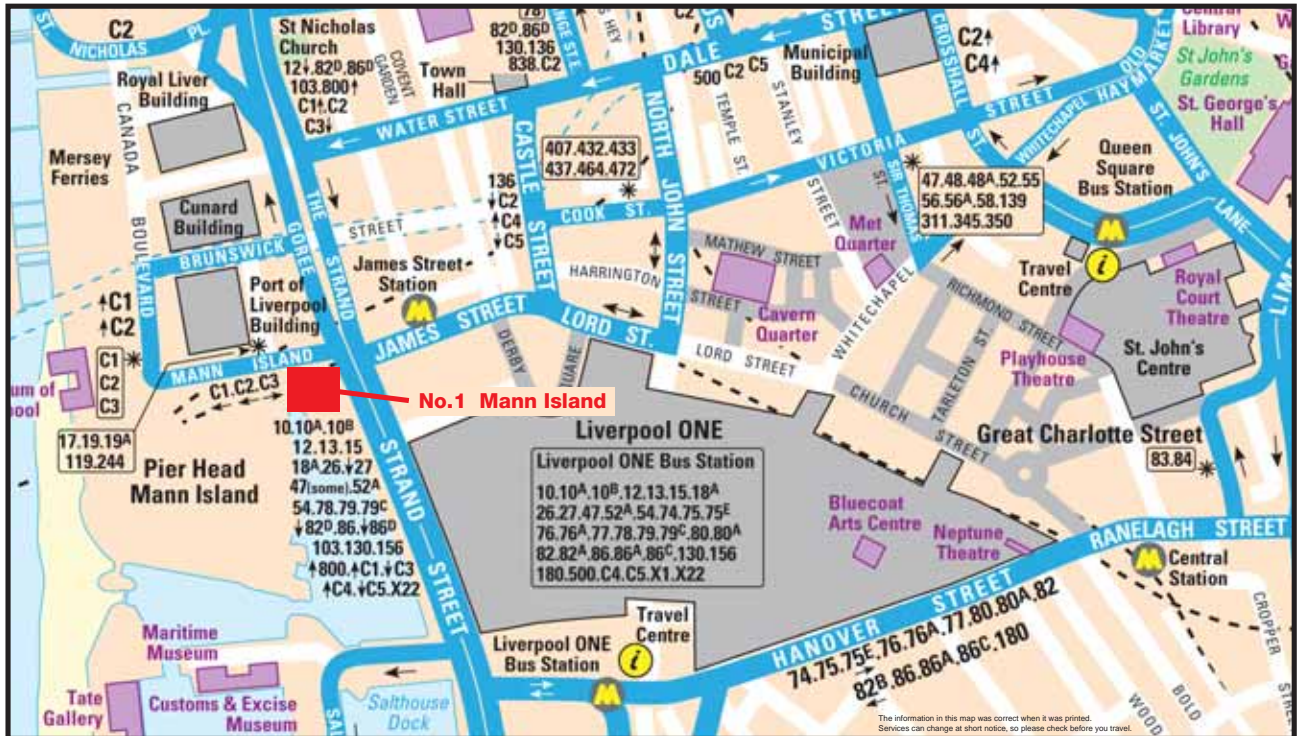
A direct commuter service operates between Seacombe and Pier Head during Monday to Friday morning peak times, between 0720 – 0950. Ferries run every 20 minutes, with the crossing taking just 10 minutes. During afternoon peak times, between 1615 - 1915, the ferry travels between Pier Head, Seacombe and Woodside, and then back to Pier Head. Afternoon ferries run every 30 minutes.
